The chamber sold out of T-shirts, sweatshirts and hoodies. "We have already decided to order double for next year," Warner said of the chamber fundraiser.

Money raised is used to promote the small town.

"It's for getting the word out," she said. "We worked on our website and put in a lot of effort on that this year, making it more informative."

Warner is heading to the Puyallup Sportsman Trade Show this weekend to represent the town's variety of outdoor activities that include hunting, fishing, snowmobiling, ATV travel and a newly added wooden quilt trail in town.

"There are wooden barn quilts like posters or pictures through town," she said. "They are historic quilts painted on plywood."

Warner said organizers are energized by this year's success, so much that so they are already planning next year's event.

One possible change could include an air horn to signify the start of the race – and help fans get off the course and alert those at the finish line to be prepared.

Other changes may up the competition by adding a commercial division for business entries, an official children's category (an impromptu class was created this year) and a Clydesdale class, where every racer must weigh more than 200 pounds, she said.

The senior division, where the three entrants must have ages adding up to 125 years, may also be raised next year by a decade or two or three.
